


Let Justice Flow - updated links and information

Universal Credit paragraph

In the past, people in the UK receiving welfare payments would receive one or more of six different types of benefits. However, from 2013 the government started to introduce out a new benefit which rolls all of these into one monthly payment: Universal Credit.

Universal Credit might sound like a good idea, but in reality there are problems with Universal Credit that are so serious they are causing real hardship to many of those receiving it. For example, there is a 5 week wait before the first payment where families go without the money they need. To fill this gap they are offered a loan which places already struggling families in debt. There has also been concern over the fact that Universal Credit payments are often paid late or not in full. The evidence that Universal Credit is causing hardship and hunger is mounting, for example research from the Trussell Trust shows that in where Universal Credit is introduced food bank use increases.

Equality – gender

This document does not tackle the additional gender equality issues facing those who are trans (those whose gender is not the same as or does not sit comfortably with the sex they were assigned at birth) or non-binary (those who identify outside of the gender binary male/female) who may also be affected by inequality, prejudice and discrimination.



