- 20% is held by CFL to cover administration, advocacy, education, and grants e.g. climate advocacy

Types of Gifts to Consider

- Specific - an object or piece of property
- Pecuniary - a sum of money
- Residuary - a gift of money or assets left when other legacies and expenses have been paid. This gift is the most common type left to charities and allows you to take care of all your other beneficiaries first
