




Why would you leave a gift in your will?

Types of gifts

- Specific: an object, like a piece of property or a work of art
- Pecuniary: this is a sum of money
- Residuary: a gift of money or asset left when other legacies and expenses have been paid. This last type is the most common gift left to charities. It allows you to take care of your loved ones first.

- 75% goes to Christian Aid
