



Joshua 2: 1-7 - Rahab's brave decision

Rahab was a woman who did not always make good choices in her life, but when faced with two spies from an invading army hiding in her home, she chose to protect them and not give them up to the king's soldiers.

Later in the story, she uses a red rope tied to her window to show the invading army which was her house so that she would not be harmed by them.

Let's make a red rope bracelet or bookmark to remind us that we can be brave because God is with us, even when we have courageous decisions to make. You will need six long strands of red wool. Tie them together at the top and then divide them into two sets of three and tie each of these together at the bottom. Wrap the first set of three round the second and pass them through the loop you make, forming a knot around the second group of strands. Then do the same, this time wrapping the second group round the first and looping them through. This will form a ribbon of wool plaited together. When it is long enough to make a bracelet or a bookmark, tie it off at the end.


