God planned and prepared to send Jesus to earth as a baby to help all people understand how much God loves them – and that means you and me!

Sometimes God shares clues about God's plans with people so that they can share them with others. These people are prophets and their messages are called prophesies. Micah was a prophet who spoke about God's plan 300 years before Jesus was actually born.

Why not make your own advent calendar to count the days until Christmas. You will need a simple nativity set or picture and 24 small items such as stones or lego bricks to form a footpath leading to the nativity set. Lay it out in a place where it won't get knocked. If you use stones, you could paint numbers on them or decorate them with Christmas colours and designed. Each day, remove one step on the path as you get nearer and nearer to Christmas Day.

Week 2

The angels sent the shepherds to see the new baby who had been promised – an event for everybody! – and to share the news with everyone they met. It must have been an amazing experience.

Cut a paper plate in half, then cut one section in half again to make two quarters. Paint and decorate your plate with glitter glue or sparkles. Cut two slits in the half plate as marked in the picture – you may need some adult help.

Bend the half plate round to form a cone and use tape to stick it in place. Slip the pointed ends of the quarter pieces through the two slits to form wings and tape in place on the inside.

Cut a circle out of thin card and draw an angel's face on it as though singing. Glue it at the top of the cone. You could use a piece of pipe cleaner or tinsel to form a halo. Cut out two hands and use a folded piece of paper to make a song book and glue those in place. Where will you put your lovely angel ornament? Maybe at the top of the tree! Or you could attach a loop of ribbon or wool and hang it up for all to see.

An Event for Everyone

Psalm 72:10-11 - gifts from afar

The psalm talks about people, especially kings, from all nations of the world coming to worship Jesus. It links to the story of the wise men or astrologers from the East that we know from the nativity story. Jesus was not just for people in one place and time, Jesus was and is for everyone.

Often at this time of year or any time from November to February, people make Christingles. Perhaps you could make one too. You need an orange, a red ribbon, four cocktail sticks, some dried fruit or small sweets, and a candle.

Each item represents something: The orange represents the world, the red ribbon (or tape) symbolises the love of Christ, the cocktail sticks represent the four corners of the earth, the sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations and the lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness. As we make the Christingle, we think about God's diff to the whole world in

darkness. As we make the Christingle, we think about God's gift to the whole world in Jesus and how each one of us is part of God's story.

It's Christmas! Jesus was born – God in the form of a tiny baby – to live a human life like ours and bring God's love closer. It's the perfect time to celebrate and have a party.

Let's make one more decoration for the Christmas tree. You will need six lollipop sticks, glue, green paint, a white or silver marker pen or paint, and a gold marker pen or paint or a gold star-shaped sticker. You also need glue. One lollipop stick will make the trunk of a tree. Paint the other lollipop sticks green. Cut them to size so you have one complete stick then five other pieces, each slightly shorter than the rest. The shortest pieces can probably be cut from one stick. Glue them the length of the stick forming the trunk, so that they get smaller the higher up the trunk they are, to form a Christmas tree shape. On them, paint or write the words: "FOR UNTO US A CHILD IS BORN", and paint a star on the top one. Use some tinsel or a pipe cleaner to make a loop at the top so you can hang it up.
