Candlemas, the day we remember that the baby Jesus was taken to the temple to be presented to God, is in February, forty days after Christmas. But this week we are thinking about the story as part of our Christmas season.

When a baby is born in a hospital, a band is often put round their ankle with their name on it. Our activity today is to make a bracelet or anklet which reminds us of who Jesus is. You will need some coloured beads or blank beads you can colour, or you can make your own with tube pasta or with rolled up strips of newspaper. You will also need a string to thread them on.

White bead – for the angel who told Mary and Joseph that Jesus would be born Brown bead – for the people of the past who shared news that God would send Jesus Yellow bead or star shape – for the star that shone over the stable

Red bead – a reminder that Jesus loves us and died for us

Black bead – to remind us that the world has bad things like fighting and sadness and greed and loneliness

Silvery bead – to remind us that Jesus is like God's light in the darkness, our hope. Gold bead – to remind us that Jesus is an incredible, indescribable gift from God

Bible Reading Luke 2: 25-33 Simeon

²⁵ A man named Simeon lived in Jerusalem. He was a good man and very religious. He was waiting for the time when God would help Israel. The Holy Spirit was in him. ²⁶ The Holy Spirit told Simeon that he would not die before he saw the Christ promised by the Lord. ²⁷ The Spirit led Simeon to the Temple. Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the Temple to do what the law said they must do. ²⁸ Then Simeon took the baby in his arms and thanked God:

- ²⁹ "Now, Lord, you can let me, your servant, die in peace as you said.
- ³⁰ I have seen your Salvation[a] with my own eyes.

- ³² He is a light for the non-Jewish people to see. He will bring honor to your people, the Israelites."
- ³³ Jesus' father and mother were amazed at what Simeon had said about him.
