The Bible is made up of 66 books written by lots of different people. There are stories, letters, poems, histories, and much more. It was written over many years. Let's make some paper to write our own letters to God on.

You will need some newspaper and other scrap paper ripped into small pieces. Soak it overnight in a large container full of water then put the paper in a blender or food processor and blend it into a pulp (remember to ask permission first!). Pour it through a sieve to get rid of as much water as you can. Place a tea-towel over a baking tray or board and put the paper pulp on it, flattening it down a bit. Then put another tea-towel on top and use a rolling pin to press down so that the pulp is flattened and the water soaks out into the cloths.

Remove the top tea-towel and allow the paper to dry in the air/sun, then turn it over and let the other side dry too. Once it is completely dry (you could use a hairdryer to help!) you have some paper to write on. What would you write to God?
