



Matthew 6:9-13 The Lord's Prayer

When we add a little prayer to our lives, our lives get better, just like adding a bit of sweetness or spice to a recipe. Here's a recipe you can make with your family, and when you're using the spoons for some of the ingredients, think about saying thank you, sorry or please to God.

You need: 18 tablespoons (100g) oats; 13 tablespoons (100g) self-raising flour; 8 tablespoons (100g) soft brown sugar; 1.5 teaspoons cinnamon; 1 large free-range egg; 2 tablespoons runny honey; 2 tablespoons unrefined rapeseed oil; 2 tablespoons water; 2 carrots, grated

What you do: Preheat the oven to 175 degrees/Gas Mark 4. Mix together oats, flour, sugar and cinnamon. Beat egg in a separate bowl then add to the dry ingredients with the honey, oil and water. Stir in the carrots and mix well. Using two teaspoons, place small balls of the mixture onto baking parchment on a baking tray and cook for 10-12 minutes. Allow to cool.
