

Exodus 2.1-10 - Moses in the river

You need scissors, some glue, some wool, some lollipop sticks (an odd number) and a paper cup.

Cut the top off the paper cup about 3 cm from the base so you have a very shallow bowl shape left. Now glue lollipop sticks around it. Because the base of the cup slopes outwards, the sticks will be close together at the base but spaced out further up. Once the glue is dry, you can weave the wool in and out of the sticks, working your way up with different coloured layers. Use a bit of glue to secure the wool at the top.

Your basket is now ready to fill with goodies. Who will you give it to?
