#### John 1 40-44 - St Andrew's Day

St Andrew was one of Jesus's first disciples. He chose to follow Jesus and also to bring other people to Jesus, including his brother Simon. St Andrew is known as the patron Saint of Scotland.

Let's make something traditional to Scotland to remember St Andrew. No, we're not making haggis! We're making shortbread. Remember you may need an adult to help with the cooking part of this.

Preheat an oven to 190C/Gas 5. Beat together 125g softened unsalted butter and 55g caster sugar until smooth. Stir in 180g plain flour and mix together to form a ball. Roll it out until it's 1cm thick and then cut into fingers or circles. Put the pieces on a baking tray, prick with a fork, sprinkle with a bit more caster sugar, and put in the fridge for 20 minutes to chill. Bake for 15-20 minutes until golden brown and allow to cool. You could use icing to decorate them with the Scottish flag!







