



Luke 15:1-6 The lost sheep.

Take some wool and wrap it round and round your fingers – not too tightly. When you have wrapped it round about 30 times slip a long piece of wool under the wound wool and bring it up and round and tie a knot. This should secure the wool enough for you to cut the loop ends with scissors to create a pom pom ball. Finish off your sheep by cutting out a face and hooves and attaching them to your sheep. Perhaps you could make a whole host of sheep and, using a play toy shepherd, act out the psalm from today's story.

One day when many tax collectors and other outcasts came to listen to Jesus, ² the Pharisees and the teachers of the Law started grumbling, "This man welcomes outcasts and even eats with them!" ³ So Jesus told them this parable:

⁴ "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them—what do you do? You leave the other ninety-nine sheep in the pasture and go looking for the one that got lost until you find it. ⁵ When you find it, you are so happy that you put it on your shoulders ⁶ and carry it back home. Then you call your friends and neighbors together and say to them, 'I am so happy I found my lost sheep. Let us celebrate!'
