Psalm 119:101-105 Your word is a light

Theme: The Bible is a guide and a light for your journey with God.

Introduction: What would be helpful to know before we begin?

Psalms

Psalm 119 is the longest psalm in the Bible. We've explored Psalm 119 before in FACT but this time we're looking at just a few verses (101 - 105) about halfway through.

These verses give us the idea that God's Word, as revealed in the Bible, is like a light that shines on the path ahead to help us see our way.

It might be read as if we must stay on the path and not ever stray (like always doing everything our teacher tells us at school!) or we will be punished in some way, but the passage tells us that we shouldn't follow God's path because we must – but because we will want to – it's 'sweeter than honey'. We may, sometimes, stumble but that's okay because God's Word is there to help us to get back on the right path. And it's not a narrow path – it is a path that lets us live life in all its fullness, to enjoy all that God has given to us.

As with everything in the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, we must always remember that it must be read in the context of the time it was written. Some things may seem outdated or irrelevant to us today – the important thing is to think about the meaning not the actual words.

In-person and online game

See this week's Faith Adventures: Children Together for suitable games for this theme.

Glow stick pictionary

A game of making word pictures using only light (glow sticks.)

You will need:

A selection of thin glow sticks, straight, thin and some made into braclets for each team.

A selection of words to be used for each group (words on cards).

A dark space to play in.

How to play:

Seperate the group into teams. Each team sits in a space. One at a time the team send a player to the card table for a word from the pile. They then run back to their group and using the glow sticks they create the word given. Once the group have guessed correctly another player runs for the next word.

At the end of a set time count how many words each team guessed correctly. Consider what words might be best for straight lines and circles for example, house, bike, fire, glasses, yellow brick road, star, fireworks, tree, people and so on.

- How would you describe the way the words of the Bible might help people? Is there anything in the Bible that makes you feel the way Colton Dixon and Daniel Ojo express?

Explore

Ideas and activities to explore this week's Bible passage together

A new way to explore the theme

You may wish to use the explore section from this week's Faith Adventures: Children Together to guide your exploration of the theme this week.

Alternatively:

Divide into teams giving them access to the following verses (remove the Bible references) and ask them to decide which are from the Bible and which are not. You may want to come up with your own verses and phrases.

To help them decide, provide some Bible reference books, youth Bibles or encourage them to use the internet or bible app 'Bible Gateway'.

Men should not have long hair (1 Corinthians 11:14)

God will forgive you up to 70 times, and no more




Come back together and see how you compare, how hard or easy was this? Any of the 'Bible verses' surprise you? Any that are not Bible verses surprise you?

What is your favourite Bible verse and why?

If you are able to, either invite one or two people to your session, such as the minister or a youth leader, and interview them about their favourite Bible verses or ask people in other church settings, such as coffee time.

Modern parables

This section includes references to TV programmes, films, books, TED talks, TikTok etc aimed at this age group that will have been widely seen, or where a clip is available to use as a stimulus for discussion. You may also enjoy the picture book recommended for Faith Adventures: Children Together and explore the relevance of the story to the theme of the session in more depth – young people and adults are often well tuned in to the deeper meanings in materials aimed at younger people and the authors are often very aware of the adults reading the books to or with younger ones.

Express
