John 14:16-17 – God is...Three in One

Theme: Exploring the Trinity and what it means in our faith journey.

Introduction: What would be helpful to know before we begin?

The Trinity is a difficult concept to understand so you may find this website helpful in explaining it. https://kids.kiddle.co/Trinity You may want to approach the session as an exploration of the idea of Trinity and what it means to those present (including yourselves).

John 14 comes within the events of Holy Week in the Bible. The few verses this session focuses on are within a passage about the Holy Spirit. The line '*Then I will ask the Father to send you the Holy Spirit* who will help you and always be with you' is suggestive of three peoples – the Trinity. This session therefore aims to look at the relationship of the three as one. Be aware of how the language used in the passage may trigger some who have not had a good experience with father figures and for those who find it difficult to relate to Father, Son and Holy Spirit when they are each sometimes referred to only as he.





Together

Let's start our time with God and each other well

If used in a mixed-age group, then young people can support younger ones in using the gathering prayer in Faith Adventures: Children Together. If used in a youth group, you could use this opening prayer or encourage young people to open the session with a prayer of their own.

All mighty God,

Be with us as we learn more about you through stories and people in the Bible.

Help us to walk in your way and follow your path.

Be with us as we make decisions that affect our lives, and the lives of those around us.

In-person - Object Improvisation

From a range of different objects (eg broom, cushion, newspaper, water bottle), take turns to pick up an item and use it in a way that is different to its intended use. Get creative and see how many ways you can come up with to use the objects.

Thinking about the Trinity through a reflective story

In the Bible passage, Jesus is talking to his friends the disciples and tells them that through him they are able to know God. Jeus tells them that when he has returned to be with God, God will send a helper - the Holy Spirit. Christians believe that the hidden face of God was made visible on earth as Jesus, and that God continues to be with us as the Holy Spirit.

You will need:

- three large circles of felt or you could draw circles in a sand tray
- something to represent the world e.g. a small globe
- three small wooden figures
- a battery candle
- baby Jesus from a nativity set or a small peg doll
- shepherd and sheep
- a small cross (a holding cross works well)
- a small jug of water and a bowl
- a dove which could be a picture or a white feather
- a flame cut out of felt or card
- a heart

Do not worry if you do not have the items - you can use pictures instead.

Have all your items in a box beside you. As you tell the story keep your focus on the items and say each phrase slowly and add the items with care.

Today, with this box, we are going to explore the wonder of God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; God being one in three and three in one, we call it the Trinity.

Take the lid off the box

Place the first circle down in front of you

This circle is for God;

God who created the world,

Place your globe or world in the circle

God who created dark and light and separated the land from the sea,

Place the dark and light circle down and pour some water into the bowl

God who made us in his own image.

Place a person figure in the circle

Place a second circle down slightly overlapping the first

This circle is for God's Son, Jesus, who rescued the world,

Place a figure in the circle

Jesus, God's son who was born as a baby.









Jesus said, "I am a light in the world that can never be put out." Add a battery candle to the circle Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd who looks after his sheep." Add the shepherd and sheep to the circle Jesus died on the cross to save each one of us. Add a cross to the circle Place the third circle down overlapping the other two so that it makes a Venn diagram. This circle is for the Holy Spirit, The Holy Spirit came as a dove when Jesus was baptised, Place your feather or dove in the circle

Add your nativity Jesus or small peg doll to the circle

The Holy Spirit came as wind and as tongues of fire at Pentecost, Add the flame to the circle

The Holy Spirit who God sent to live in us, who gives power and comfort to the people of God.

Add a figure to the circle Pause...

In the centre of the circles where they cross, place a heart

God who loves us and made us:

God the Creator.

Move the figure in the God circle to the centre and place on the heart God the Son,

Move the second figure to the centre and place on the heart

God the Holy Spirit.

Move the third figure to the centre

Make a circular motion around the centre figures with

your finger and say:

God loves us:

Three in one and one in three.





- I wonder what symbols you might you add to the circles?
- I wonder what do the symbols mean to you?

Continue to explore the children's thoughts about the Trinity. Allow the children to think about their relationship with God and to have time exploring their thoughts about God.

Modern parables

This section includes references to TV programmes, films, books, TED talks, TikTok etc aimed at this age group that will have been widely seen, or where a clip is available to use as a stimulus for discussion. You may also enjoy the picture book recommended for Faith Adventures: Children Together and explore the relevance of the story to the theme of the session in more depth – young people and adults are often well tuned in to the deeper meanings in materials aimed at younger people and the authors are often very aware of the adults reading the books to or with younger ones.

Talking together: Going deeper

- When we start a prayer with Dear God, are we talking to Jesus and the Holy Spirit too?
- If there is a Holy Spirit, is there an unholy spirit?
- The word Trinity means three things in one. The bible passage describes Spirit as the helper. What names would you give to the three elements of the Trinity?

Express

How do we respond to what we've discussed and express our faith personally?

Praying together

Prayer Respond to the theme by writing or saying a short prayer. Alternatively use the creative prayer from Faith Adventures: Children Together for this session, or use the prayer activity below.

Alternatively light a candle and play some music while you listen and talk to God together.

Thinking about all the names and images there are for God, Jesus and Spirit, encourage everyone to think of their own words and add them to this prayer.









God, Almighty, Creator, Father, Mother, ...

You created us and love us. One in three and three in one, we praise you.

Jesus, Shepherd, Friend, Light of the world, Guide,... You heal us, teach us and show us the way. One in three and three in one, we thank you.

Holy Spirit, Counsellor, Comforter, Encourager, Dove, Flame,... You inspire us and fan the flame within us. One in three and three in one, be with us always.

We see you in so many ways but we know that you are our God and we are your children. We give you thanks and praise. Amen

Responding together

This is an opportunity for a social justice challenge, some research, craftivism, or a craft or STEM activity. You may have a specific activity chosen but free choice is also an option. Here are some suggestions for this week's theme. See Faith Adventures: Children Together for a craft and a STEM activity which may also be appropriate. Choose whatever will work best for your group.

Fire Triangle

You will need -

- A candle
- Matches/lighter
- Candle snuffer
- An adult to supervise

Light the candle and encourage the group to think about the three things that are needed for the flame to keep burning.

- Fuel wax and wick
- Oxygen from the air
- Heat from friction of striking match

All three of these things are needed for the flame to continue burning, if one is removed then the flame will go out. This is known as the fire triangle.

Ask the group to think about ways that they could stop the candle burning by removing one part of the fire triangle. (Demonstrate by blowing and snuffing out the candle)

What is removed by the following actions: Blowing out candle – heat Putting water on candle – heat Covering flame with candle snuffer – oxygen Candle has no more wax – fuel

Father, Son and Holy Spirit are also three elements which would not be whole and could not work in our lives as God intended if one were taken away or ignored.







Challenge:

Discipleship doesn't stop when you walk out of the church door – it is a part of everyday life. Take a challenge with you and try to make it part of your week.

You may think of your own suggestion of what you as an individual or a group might do in the coming week in response to what you have explored today? If not here are some suggestions:

- Use one of the "conversation starter" questions or the question below to talk with someone of a different generation or from a different setting and share your questions, thoughts, insights together. I wonder where your help comes from?
- Research something suggested by JPIT, Resources (jpit.uk) Commitment For Life cforl.co.uk
- As you start each new day take some time to pray a triangle prayer. With each step you take, prayer to God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. If you do not have room to physically do this you could imagine it in your mind or draw it on paper.
