Going Deeper

Seeing is Believing?

The conductor tells the children about when he nearly fell off the train, but didn't. He says to them "Sometimes seeing is believing and sometimes the most real things in the world are the things we can't see". Read John, chapter 20, verses 24 - 29. Do you need to 'see' something before you can believe it?

After their encounter with the Caribou, the train starts to gain speed and becomes out of control, with the children and the conductor at the front of the engine. The conductor straps the children in and they all hold on tightly as they go on a terrifying rollercoaster ride! Read Joshua, chapter 1, verse 9. How does it make you feel to know that no matter what is happening, God is with you, wherever you go?

Throughout the film, the conductor keeps checking his pocket watch (can you remember what time it says?). The conductor says "I've never been late before and I'm not going to be tonight". Read Psalm 31, verse 15 and then read 2 Peter, chapter 3, verses 8 - 9. What does it mean to you, that everything is in God's timing?


The BIG Question

Snuggle in and watch the film!




Have a go at some of the activities. While you do, you could have a chat. What spoke to you in the film? Where do you see yourself or God in the film?
