ADVENT RESOURCE 2024– Step into the Story



This year's Advent Packs from the URC Children's and Youth Work team invite people to 'step into the story' as we focus on Christmas as everyone's story with traditions, crafts and recipes from around the world to enrich the celebration.

The packs, designed for local URC churches to give to families they have connection with, come in A5 envelopes which are left unsealed for churches to add their own material and invitations. Packs contain an original story book, a book full of inspiring activities and an A3 sticker Advent calendar to engage with the Christmas story. There will be a separate A2 poster for churches to display and ideas for linking church activities to the packs.

KNOW AND GROW - MAKATON COURSE FOR CHURCHES

As part of our drive to help churches become increasingly accessible and welcoming to all, URC Training is delighted to be able to offer subsidised access to the new KNOW AND GROW training, a Makaton course which focuses specifically on the signs you might use in worship and church-based groups. Makaton is a system of signing and using symbols to aid spoken and written communication.



Each course comprises two online sessions and you must be able to attend both. Sadly, due to limited spaces, we can offer this only to those associated with a URC church or LEP. The cost is just £18 to cover the printed manual which you will be able to keep.

Sessions are 9.30am-12.30pm on Friday 20 & 27 September, Saturday 21 & 28 September, Saturday 12 & 19 October.

CHILDREN, YOUNG PEOPLE AND YOUNG ADULTS MAKING THE HEADLINES IN THE UNITED REFORMED CHURCH

We have been delighted to award Lundie medals to two more under-26s who are playing their part in the mission of God. The first went to 16 year old **Lily Wood** from South Western Synod. Lily volunteers weekly at Westfield Show Choir (a church-based community choir for children and young people from many different backgrounds, and with ADHD, autism, anxiety disorders etc), assists with fundraising and a holiday club for the choir, and organises the church Christingle service.



The second went to 17 year old **Faith Pepper** from Eastern Synod. Faith is described as an invaluable part of the Youth Work team and a keen evangelist, involved in the planning, leading and volunteering for a wide range of activities within the church family, including an SEND Messy Church, junior church and youth club. She also produces PowerPoint slides for all-age worship and mentors young people.

DO YOU HAVE UNIFORMED GROUPS CONNECTED WITH YOUR CHURCH?

A new small grant of £50 or £100 is now available from Children's and Youth Work/Discipleship Development Fund to support churches seeking to strengthen their relationship with a uniformed group (Boys' Brigade, Girls' Brigade, Guiding or Scouting). https://bit.ly/CYWgrants

This could be anything from provision of accommodation to funding a suitable event or activity. The church might host a sleepover event, donate resources or give URC Children and/or URC Youth cloth badges to the members; or the groups might organise a cleanup of the church gardens, redecoration of the space they use, joint eco project or other creative idea. This could be matched funding to a URC Guide & Scout Fellowship grant www.urcgsf.org.uk) or a stand-alone grant.

SPARKS AND STORIES is this year's holiday club material from URC Children's and Youth Work. Tying in with the annual CYW theme of Story, Story, Story, the 2024 holiday club invites you to gather round the campfire, marshmallows on sticks and hot chocolate in hand, and share in the greatest story of all. https://bit.ly/URC-holidayclub



As usual, the resource is supported with appendices helping you adapt the material for younger children, young people, intergenerational groups and vintage holiday club. Also provided are videos of the dramas and stories along with all the paperwork you might need to run your holiday club.

Running from 1 to 3 November at the beautiful Ripon College, Cuddesdon, this is an opportunity to be refreshed and encouraged in your ministry amongst children and families, whether you are an employed worker or volunteer.

Here are some highlights from the programme:

- Friday: Welcome and worship, interactive getting to know you session, late
 -night programme and bedtime story
- Saturday: Worship and Keynote, Workshops, exploring seasonal resources and ideas, focused groups, Family Film night experience, Bedtime story
- Sunday: Keynote and small groups, Worship Brick Church




The provisional workshops on offer are on child participation, intergenerational ministry, storytelling, and Music in ministry while the session on exploring seasonal resources and ideas offers a choice of seasons of life (eg transitions, baptisms and communion), Church in the seasons outside, seasons of the Christian calendar, and the difficult seasons (e.g. bereavement and loss, Mothers' Day etc).

There will be an exhibition of resources for you to explore and lots of opportunity to share ideas and network with others, together with chance to relax and enjoy the beautiful surroundings of Ripon College.

The cost of all this, including accommodation, meals and other refreshments, is £150 per person with some places available for day visitors. Don't forget to approach your church and your synod for financial support or grant funding.

On 10 September from 1pm to 3.30pm, the URC Safeguarding team will be offering a zoom workshop on the theme of safeguarding children and young people in churches.
