CHILDREN, YOUNG PEOPLE AND YOUNG ADULTS MAKING THE HEADLINES IN THE UNITED REFORMED CHURCH

8-year-old Matilda Willis of West Midlands Synod has been proactive in suggesting all-age activities to the leader of her Messy Church. She is spending the money from her Lundie Award on bird feeders for the church grounds and small Christmas gifts for all the other children at Messy Church.

Brothers Tawonga (age 20) and Malumbo (age 16) Mtika of Southern Synod received the Lundie Memorial Award for October for applying their tech skills to regularly supporting worship in their church. They control the sound and projection system and facilitate the livestreaming of the service.



Reports are still coming in from the churches who received small grants to support their holiday clubs this year. The team love seeing all the photos and hearing about the fun the children and team members had, whether using one of our three URC resources or



choosing a different theme. One such example was Westfield URC who spent a week preparing to put on a performance about Joseph. For the show itself, a team of six children handled all the tech with minimal input from the adults.

Why not nominate them for the Lundie Memorial Award?



RESOURCES TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH WORK

NEW IN: GO WITH GRETA / #CONNECT 2 ZIMBABWE

The annual resource from URC Commitment for Life and URC Children's and Youth Work is now available and has been sent out to all Commitment for Life churches and Pilots companies as well as being available online.

It is a two part magazine containing sessions for 5-11s and 11-14s about Zimbabwe, one of the regions supported by Commitment for Life in partnership with Christian Aid. It also includes ideas for an intergenerational celebration, with recipes, games and activities as well as Bible studies, prayers and action points.





REGENERATIONAL is launched on 15 November! This exciting international collaborative project which provides four outlines of intergenerational worship designed to introduce and promote the principles of intergenerational ministry in your church. ONLINE YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID (MHFA®) COURSE Tom Hackett, CYDO for Southern Synod, and Steven Mitchell, CYDO for Mersey Synod, have scheduled another Online Youth Mental Health First Aid course to take place in December. This training is for people living, working and volunteering with young people age 8-18 and is open to participants associated with local URCs and LEPs linked to the URC. Please do not register for this event if you do not meet this criteria. Spaces are offered at a subsidised rate of £29.50 per person. Participants must attend all four sessions.
