Feature Story - Girls excel at schools in Bangladesh

Together we learn: a fairer future starts with us

Government stats show that girls do much better than the boys in the Bangladeshi Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations.

Girls are doing better than boys year on year. The pass rate of the girls was 1.53 percentage points higher than that of the boys across eight educational boards. Officials say that the girls generally are more attentive. "Girls are spending more time in studies than boys."

Our Christian Aid partners focus quite intentionally on the upliftment of women and girls in Bangladesh. This is because women take such an active role in the well-being of communities. They make excellent co-collaborators in support community cohesion and in addressing the underlying causes of vulnerability, and for investing in livelihoods and care.
